Background: God has blessed Trinity Church and its world mission program in the past ten years. We have now come to a point where we have a prototype for bringing the Gospel to unreached groups around the world.

Trinity Church is now focusing on five people groups:

The Sabiny Tribe in NE Uganda.

The Acholi Tribe in Northern Uganda

The Chuukese people here on Oahu and in Micronesia

The Marshallese people here on Oahu and in Micronesia

The Filipino people here on Oahu in the Philippines

To effectively reach them and other people groups with the Gospel Trinity Church has established:

The Hawaii Center for World Mission

The purpose of the center is as follows:

1. To faithfully respond to the great commission.
2. To direct individuals and churches to unreached people groups.
3. To facilitate bringing the Gospel to unreached people groups.
4. To provide training for those who will go to unreached people groups.
5. To sponsor short term mission trips to unreached people groups.
6. To provide leadership and training in world missions in Hawaii.
7. To provide ESL training to minister to recent immigrants and others with a goal toward sharing the Gospel and teaching new comers to the islands how to read the Scriptures.
8. To provide computer education for recently arriving immigrants.
9. To encourage the missionaries supported by Trinity Church in France, South Korea, the Mideast, and Czech Republic.
10. To enlist, train and assist faithful Christians in Hawaii to go on short-term mission trips.

Our immediate goals include:

1. Hosting the Kairos course, a nine week course that introduces world missions and the world Christian movement.
2. Establishing two more radio station stations, one in Gulu, Uganda and a second in Western Uganda.
3. Completing our orphanage in Gulu Uganda.
4. Improving the quality of care at our small hospital in Kaserem, Uganda.
5. Establishing medical outreaches to the people of Northern Uganda.

6. Planting a church in Suam near the Kenya border and a third church in Gulu.
7. Sponsoring key men for theological training in East Africa.
8. Advancing church growth by sharing with others the concept of planting presbyteries rather than individual congregations.
9. Providing ongoing training, support and encouragement to pastors and Christian workers in Uganda.
10. Providing Bibles, Christian books and training materials for Christian leaders.
